How to help at home:

Enjoy reading and sharing books together, visit the local library. Continue to celebrate phonics learning and explore phonics card together at home. Bring simple maths into everyday life – weighing out ingredients, measuring growth in height, singing number songs. Encourage challenge and perseverance with independence skills. Enjoy chatting with and listening to your child as they ask questions and share their thoughts on topics that ignite their curiosity.
